Letter from the Executive Director



Ramadan Food Baskets

On every Friday during the Holy month of Ramadan during its two occurrences in the 2022-2023 period, Iraqi Children's Hope, through its volunteers, distributed food baskets to various groups of disadvantaged people within the community in both Basra and Samawah, including women, children, and hundreds of families in need. These food baskets included staple food items and essential provisions to ensure families could observe Ramadan with dignity and comfort.

Eid Clothes for Children

Visiting Cancer Patients

On 2 occasions, representatives from our organization visited the **Children's Specialist Hospital** in Basra City and the cancer ward at the **Al-Hussein Teaching Hospital** in Samawah Governorate. We aimed to understand the needs of these young patients and offer them health materials, medicines, and gifts of joy to support them in overcoming the obstacles they encounter.

Dr. Qasim Basry, our founder and CEO, personally presented these gifts to the hospitalized children. Our team was able to provide support during their journeys, and provide life-saving treatments to over 100 children in need. Your generous support remains instrumental in bringing happiness and inspiration to these courageous young fighters





Empowering Women: Literacy Courses & Sewing Classes

Iraqi Children's Hope, as part of its values for development and empowerment, held a course to teach women how to read and write. These women had expressed a strong desire and seriousness to learn. This course included **15 teaching sessions**, and the women registered in this course all regularly attended and completed any homework, demonstrating their commitment to self-improvement. We honored outstanding students at the graduation ceremony at the end of the course.









Additionally, as part of our commitment to enabling widowed women to earn a decent living and support their families, we also held a sewing workshop to develop the capabilities of widowed women for a period of **35 days**, in which the women were taught sewing, design, and embroidery.

These women showed great interest in learning and daily practice, and were rewarded with certificates at the end of the course











A Widow's Journey to a Better Place

When a widow had first approached us a couple years ago, she was consumed by despair after tragically losing her husband. She had tearfully shared with us how her children had **gone to bed hungry** the night before, and how, even by noon the next day, she still had **no food to give them**. With no income and no path to move foward, she was feeling completely hopeless.

After spending 2 years with our program, she'd found the tools and support to rebuild her life. Through her hard work and determination, she was able to start her own **market and bakery**, selling sweets and cakes that she'd make.

Today, she is fully self-sustainable, providing for her children and ensuring they never go hungry again.

Fact:



One in every 4 Iraqis fall below the poverty line.



For families that live in unsafe housing, the lack of a secure home makes life an **ongoing struggle**. For many struggling lraqi families, their homes are crumbling, unfit for children, and exposes them to health and safety risks everyday.

We recognize this need, and Iraqi Children's Hope took action, launching an initiative to construct safe housing for vulnerable families.



During the 2022-2023 year, **we successfully built 2 houses**, providing not just a shelter, but also a renewed sense of stability and dignity for these two families. Beyond uplifting these families from unsafe living conditions, this project also created jobs for local workers, supporting the community economically while addressing this critical need.

Through these efforts, we have been able to ensure that these two families no longer have to worry about the roof over their heads. Their children can now focus on schooling and their future, while living in a space they can truly call home.

This would not be possible without the generous continued donations of people like you.



Our Tutoring Initiatives

Untold numbers of Iraqi children, due to various hardships, are unable to keep up with their schooling. Those who struggle financially or face hardships have fewer educational opportunities. We offer tutoring to children who struggle to keep up with schoolwork, as well as those who feel they aren't challenged enough academically. Orphans and children who can't afford tutoring or private school tuition are prioritized. During the 2022–2023 year, we provided **thousands of hours** of tutoring to kids in grades 1–8 across all subjects with homework assistance and various other needs.

Our volunteers have made a profound difference in their lives, and we continue to contribute towards their success.


Baneen: A Success Story

Baneen is an orphan enrolled with Iraqi Children's Hope who had been struggling with school and did not have the adequate resources and support to improve academically.

Shortly after her enrollment with our tutoring services, her grades rapidly improved to near full marks, and was rewarded for gifts for her perseverance and achievement!

No child should have to endure such a hardship.

When our representatives visited her, she showed us her bite wounds. We were shocked to learn that paying for a Tuktuk vehicle for transport, costing as little as 22,000 Iraqi Dinars (~\$15) per month, could change everything for her and provide her with safe transport to school.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we were able to secure this for Haneen, along with gifts and clothes. She now goes to school with joy and enthusiaism, and her grades have significantly improved.

Meet Sherifah


A Special Wish: Sherifah's First Strawberry

Seeing his struggles, we stepped in to provide Zain with a **private tutor during the summer break**. Through one-on-one lessons tailored to his needs, he began to learn the fundamentals of reading and writing right from the comfort of his home. With every session, his confidence grew, and his progress became a source of joy for his family.

Today, Zain thrives in school, equipped with the tools to dream big. Through your generous contributions, we were able to unlock this child's potential.

Meet Roz Fuller


Roz's Dedication to Children in Need


We deeply admire her work and leadership, which has turned despair into hope, and challenges into opportunity for so many.




